


What to expect when starting your Nonprofit



- Governing Documents. We guide you through the ins-andouts of assembling your board of directors/trustees and drafting bylaws, a conflicts of interest policy, organizational meeting of the Board of Directors/Trustees, and other policies which are critical to achieving and keeping tax exempt status.
- Application for federal tax-exempt status. We decide which type of 501(c) application fits your organization. Very small organizations may qualify for an e-postcard application. Otherwise, we help you through the complex terminology and technical details to prepare and file a full application.
- Wait. The IRS takes 2-4
 weeks for an e-postcard or
 at least 6-8 months to
 approve a full application.
 They may request
 additional information. The
 approval will be retroactive
 to the date the application
 is filed.

While we wait:

- You may get state tax identification numbers/accounts, hire employees, and begin operations.
- Charitable donations and grants can be solicited with a notice that tax-exempt status is pending.
- **Determination Letter.** Hooray! When the IRS issues the Determination Letter, your organization has achieved federal tax-exempt status. We provide more detailed advice on how to maintain federal tax-exempt status going forward.
